Duties of the Commission

- Review and approve or reject challenged orders placing restrictions on water wells issued by the Commissioner of Conservation - No orders challenged
- 2. Review and comment on rules and regulations proposed by the Commissioner of Conservation Opportunity for review and comment provided
- 3. Develop a statewide ground water resource management program.
 The commission must also hold public hearings and consult with local governmental entities in the development of the program Ongoing
- 4. Review the contingency plan developed by the Commissioner of Conservation to respond to a ground water emergency Emergencies currently managed thru rules and orders
- 5. Direct the Commissioner of Conservation to promulgate rules and regulations for the appointment or designation of up to five regional bodies based on the general location of major aquifer systems and water sources of the state to be composed of local stakeholders who are representative of current users In development by direction of the commission
- 6. Attend all public meetings called by the Commissioner of Conservation Ongoing



Duties of the Commissioner

- 1. Require registration of all new water wells by water well owners Ongoing
- 2. Review the well information submitted with the notices of intent within thirty days of their receipt and upon review the Commissioner may either issue an order to the owner placing restrictions on the well or requesting additional information or allow the well to be drilled as proposed Ongoing
- 3. Determine areas of ground water concern and designate critical areas of ground water concern in accordance with R.S. 38:3097.6 Order No. AGC-1-05 issued
- 4. Collect data with respect to water wells and water resources Ongoing
- Continue development of a statewide ground water resources management program Ongoing
- 6. Develop a contingency plan to respond to a ground water emergency that gives ground water needed for human consumption the highest priority Emergencies currently managed thru rules and orders
- 7. Authorize the use of drought relief wells for agricultural use in times of drought upon a determination that sufficient water resources are otherwise not available Authorized
- 8. Enter into interagency agreements and interstate compacts in order to manage ground water resources Agreements with multiple agencies for data sharing
- 9. Enforce the Louisiana Ground Water Management Law thru issuance of compliance orders and civil penalties Ongoing

ACT No. 581

HOUSE BILL NO. 376

BY REPRESENTATIVES DOVE AND ST. GERMAIN

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To enact R.S. 38:3097.3(E), relative to ground water management; to provide for compliance orders; to provide for civil penalties and fines for violations of laws, regulations, and orders relating to ground water management; and to provide for solutions.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

Section 1. R.S. 38:3097.3(E) is hereby enacted to read as follows:

§3097.3. Commissioner of conservation; powers and duties

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E.(1) The commissioner, upon determining that a violation of this Chapter or the regulations adopted hereunder has occurred, may impose a civil penalty as provided in this Chapter. Additionally, upon determining that a violation of this Chapter has occurred, the commissioner may issue an order requiring compliance. Any such order shall state, with reasonable specificity, the nature of the violation, any cessation of activities or affirmative operations required to achieve compliance, and a time limit within which compliance with the order must be achieved. Noncompliance with any such order to comply shall constitute a violation of this Chapter, and the commissioner may impose a civil penalty for such violation. Any person subjected to a civil penalty shall have the right to a public hearing if requested in writing, which written request shall suspend the imposition of penalty until final action is taken by the commissioner.

(2) The commissioner is hereby authorized to assess civil penalties for each










- Declining Trend Since August 08

Ground Water Use Public Awareness Notification

Recently, the Office of Conservation has received several public inquiries and complaints of domestic water well owners providing or selling ground water from their water wells screened in the Carrizo - Wilcox aguifer to oil and gas exploration and production (E&P) operators conducting drilling, completion and stimulation operations in the Haynesville

Statutory law and regulations governing water well and ground water management for the State of Louisiana are within the jurisdiction of the Department of Transportation and Development (DOTD) and the Office of Conservation (Conservation). Conservation hereby provides this public awareness notice as an outreach and educational forum to advise water well owners that providing and selling ground water produced from domestic water wells to E&P operators for oil and gas drilling, completion or stimulation operations may be a violation of state law and regulations, including those found at La. R.S. 38:2091-38:3098.8, LAC 56:Part I (Water Wells), La. R.S. 38:3097.1, et seq., LAC 43:VI.Subpart 1 (Ground Water Management). Water well owners found to have violated these state laws and regulations may be subject to agency enforcement actions, including assessment of civil penalties.

Ground Water Proposed Rule Amendment - Update

Title 43 NATURAL RESOURCES

Part VI. Water Resources Management

Subpart 1. Ground Water Management

Chapter 1. General Provisions

§101. Applicability

A. The rules and regulations of this Subpart shall be applicable to the commissioner's jurisdiction regarding:

- 1. areas of ground water concern;
- ground water emergencies; and
- 3. management of the state's ground water resources.

B. The rules shall not alter or change the right of the commissioner to call a hearing for the purpose of taking action with respect to any matter within the commissioner's jurisdiction.

AUTHORITY NOTE: Promulgated in accordance with R.S. 38:3099 et seq.

HISTORICAL NOTE: Promulgated by the Office of the Governor, Groundwater Management Commission, LR 28:1584 (July 2002), amended by the Department of Natural Resources, Office of Conservation, LR 30:1212 (June 2004), LR 35:249 (February 2009).

§103. Definitions

A. The words defined herein shall have the following meanings when used in these Rules and Regulations for this Subpart. All other words used and not defined shall have their usual meanings unless specifically defined in Title 38 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes.

Aquifer—a ground water bearing stratum of permeable rock, sand, or gravel.

Area of Ground Water Concern—an area in which, under current usage and normal environmental conditions, sustainability of an aquifer is not being maintained due to either movement of a salt water front, water level decline, or subsidence, resulting in unacceptable environmental, economic, social, or health impacts, or causing a serious adverse impact to an aquifer, considering the areal and temporal extent of all such impacts.

Beneficial Use—the technologically feasible use of ground water for domestic, municipal, industrial, agricultural, recreational, or therapeutic purposes or any other advantageous purpose.

Commission—Ground Water Resources Commission authorized by R.S. 38:3097.4.

Commissioner—Commissioner of Conservation.

Critical Area of Ground Water Concern—an area of ground water concern, in which the commissioner finds that the sustainability of the aquifer cannot be maintained without withdrawal restrictions.

Critical Ground Water Area—an area in which, under current usage and normal environmental conditions, sustainability of an aquifer is not being maintained due to either movement of a salt water front or water level decline, or subsidence, resulting in unacceptable environmental, economic, social, or health impacts, or causing a serious adverse impact to an aquifer, considering the areal and temporal extent of all such impacts.

Domestic Well—a well used exclusively to supply the hosehold needs of the owner lessee or his family. Uses may include drinking, cooking, washing, sanitary purposes, lawn and garden watering and caring for pets. Domestic wells shall also include wells used on private farms and ranches for the feeding and caring of pets and watering of lawns, excluding livestock, crops, and ponds.

Drilling Rig Supply Well—a water well used only for the duration of the oil and gas drilling operation at the drilling location where sited for the immediate needs of drilling rig operations.

Ground Water—water suitable for any beneficial purpose percolating below the earth's surface which contains less than 10,000 mg/l total dissolved solids, including water suitable for domestic use or supply for a domestic water system.

Ground Water Emergency—an unanticipated occurrence as a result of a natural force or a man-made act which causes a ground water source to become immediately unavailable for beneficial use for the foreseeable future or drought conditions determined by the commissioner to warrant the temporary use of drought relief wells to assure the sustained production of agricultural products in the state.

Large Volume Well—a well with an 8 inch or greater diameter screen size or a well that by itself or used in conjunction with another well or group of wells on the same lease or within the same unit and screened in the same aquifer for the purposes of providing ground water for hydraulic fracturing for natural gas production and that alone or in conjunction with the other well or wells is determined by the Office of Conservation to be capable of producing 1,500 gallons per minute.

Owner—the person registered as owner of a water well with the Office of Conservation, and if there is none registered for a specific well or proposed well then the owner shall be one of the following: the legal owner of the property on which the well or hole is located, a person

Ground Water Resources Program

The purpose of this letter is first to thank you for all the great work the water well drillers are doing in Louisiana and secondly to respectfully request your assistance in helping Louisiana more comprehensively manage its groundwater resources.

As the state continues in its efforts to monitor and manage ground water use, we have found that, while the people working in your industry are knowledgeable and responsive to state laws on reporting water well drilling activity, the clients you serve are often not as familiar with their reporting requirements. That situation can make more difficult the state's task of managing a vital natural resource.

Although not your responsibility, in your role as a licensed water well driller, we have great confidence that a friendly reminder to your clients will help them comply with the state law that requires their timely completion and submission of water well installation notification forms to the Office of Conservation.

While some water well owners are already doing this, many are not. We believe you are in a great position to help us spread the word. All of us share the common goal of responsible management of our natural resources and your leadership on this issue will help us to build a better Louisiana.
