 - benefit society.



WATER LAW AND POLICY

- Employed Kai Midboe to develop this area as Director of Policy Research
- Recognition of dimensions beyond the technical
- Consortium on Water Law and Policy
 - Not build internal staff in this area
 - Facilitate interaction among talent present in bublic sector
 - Louisiana first : Tulane, LSU, Sea Grant
 - Expand beyond Louisiana, Gulf of Mexico, U.S.
 - Water Institute provide operational support



STATE OF LOUISIANA'S WATER RESOURCES

- Identify information needed for effective management of surface water and groundwater basins needing increased attention based on water availability and/or use issues
 - Assumes good management depends on a firm technical base
 - Identify basins needing appraisal
 - Inventory current data availability –suggest measures to fill gaps
 - Gaps would be filled by organizations currently doing the work - with additional resources

Water resources in the news features drought




- Louisiana is blessed with an abundance of water: Is this part of our marketing strategy?
