

# **Big Picture - Oil Spill Overview**

- There are four primary processes related to the oil spill recovery effort:
- (1) Economic Damages
- (3) Criminal Penalties
- (2) Natural Resource Damages Assessment
- (4) Discharge Penalties (Clean Water Act)
  - RESTORE Act dedicates 80% of the CWA civil penalties from DWH oil spill to the Gulf Coast Restoration Trust Fund

#### Criminal Penalties for work in Louisiana - \$1.272B

- Administered by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation
- Proposals are required to be approved by the CPRA Board and the NFWF Board
- Can only be utilized for barrier island and river diversion projects

#### **Approved expenditures:**

#### BARRIER ISLANDS

- 1. Caminada Increment II \$3.0 M for Engineering and Design
- 2. East Timbalier \$6.0M for Engineering and Design
- 3. Caminada Increment II \$155M for Construction

#### **RIVER DIVERSIONS**

- Atchafalaya River Diversions Planning
  - 1. Increase Atchafalaya Flow to Terrebonne \$4.9M for Planning
- <u>Mississippi River Diversions Engineering and Design</u>
  - 1. Mid-Barataria Sediment Diversion \$40.4M for Engineering and Design
  - 2. Mississippi River Diversions- Planning \$13.6M

## Natural Resource Damages (NRD) = \$5B+

#### Payments:

- Early Restoration \$368M received
- Additional payments-
  - 15 installments over the next 16 years.
  - The first payment will be received into Federal account one year after the entry of the Consent Decree.
  - Due to previous Criminal settlement burden the second payment will be a half payment.
  - A full payment toward Louisiana allocation is expected to be approximately \$319M


## Natural Resource Damages (NRD) = \$5B+

#### **Process:**

- Draft Programmatic Damage Assessment and Restoration Plan
- Final Consent Decree, Programmatic Damage
   Assessment and Restoration Plan anticipated early 2016
- First Payment 1 year after final Consent Decree

#### **RESTORE Act Allocation**

Funding: Transocean \$800M + BP \$4.4B = \$5.2B Total



<sup>\*</sup>Supplemented by interest generated by the Trust Fund (50% to Gulf Coast Ecosystem Restoration Council, 25% to Science Program, 25% to Centers of Excellence)

Funding: Transocean \$800M + BP \$4.4B = \$5.2B Total

#### **Bucket 1 - Direct Component:**

Equally Distributed TO \$56M + BP \$308M = \$364M 70% directed by CPRA Board = \$254.8M 30% granted to Coastal Parishes = \$109.2M

- Requires approved Multi Year Implementation Plan (State and Parish)
- CPRA Board has approved first Multi Year Implementation Plan
- On 9/21/15, U.S. Department of Treasury approved LA's Plan
- State may now apply for grants from Treasury for:
  - Houma Navigation Canal Lock for E&D (\$16M)
  - Calcasieu Ship Channel Salinity Control Measures for E&D (\$16M)
  - Adaptive Management (\$2.4M)
  - Parish Matching Program (\$3.9M)

#### **Bucket 2 - RESTORE Council Comprehensive Plan**

TO \$240M + BP \$1.32B = \$1.56B

- Requires approved Funded Priorities List (FPL)
- First FPL was out for public comment until Sept. 28
- Project grants will be submitted to the RESTORE Council.
- The following are projects LA submitted that are on the FPL:
  - West Grand Terre Beach for Engineering and Design (\$7.2M)
  - River Reintroduction into Maurepas Swamp for Engineering and Design (\$14.2M)
  - Biloxi Marsh Living Shoreline for Engineering and Design (\$3.2M)
  - Golden Triangle Marsh Creation for Engineering and Design (\$4.3M)
  - Lowermost Mississippi River Management Evaluation (\$9.3M)

# Bucket 2 – Council Selected Restoration Component Update (30%)

- Projects proposed by federal Council members that directly benefit LA and are on the FPL:
  - DOI: Jean Lafitte Canal Backfilling (\$8.7M)
  - USDA/Tribal proposal: Bayou Dularge Ridge,
     Marsh and Hydrologic Restoration (\$5.1M)

#### Bucket 3 – Impact Based State Allocations: TO \$83M + BP \$456.6M = \$539.6M

- Requires Council to establish a formula by regulation using criteria related to impact
  - Council regulations are out for public comment until:
     October 29.
  - Accessible on Council website: <u>www.restorethegulf.gov</u>
- Directed by the CPRA Board
- Requires approved State Expenditure Plan
- Once Plans are approved project grants will be submitted to the RESTORE Council


#### Bucket 4 – NOAA Science Program: TO \$4M + BP \$22M = \$26M

- To carry out research, observation, and monitoring to support, to the maximum extent practicable, the long-term sustainability of the ecosystem, fish stocks, fish habitat, and the recreational, commercial, and charter-fishing industry in the Gulf of Mexico.
- Grants will be issued to NOAA.

#### Bucket 5 – Centers of Excellence: TO \$4M + BP \$22M = \$26M

- Requires establishment of State procedures for handling grant.
- Grants will be issued to CPRA Board.
- The Water Institute of the Gulf was selected through RFP process to serve as Louisiana's Center of Excellence.


#### RESTORE Projects by Status


