Crude oil prices are now around \$13.00 per barrel. Oil prices are down because OPEC (excluding Iraq) did not fulfill its pledge to cut production 1.25 million barrels per day in April. OPEC cut only 0.9 million barrels per day, according to Hornsby & Company's Energy Risk Management Services. The Asian economy is in a full blown recession causing a decline in world oil demand. Non-OPEC producers cut output by 0.2 million barrels per day, while Iraq increased production by 0.3 million barrels per day. Crude oil prices are expected to be under \$15.00 per barrel for the next two months.


